The ending is pronounced /s/ after a voiceless sound, it is pronounced /z/ after a voiced sound and is pronounced /ɪz / or /əz/ after a sibilant sound: Voiceless: helps /ps/ -- sits /ts/ -- looks /ks/. Voiced: crabs /bz/ -- words /dz/ -- gloves /vz/, Sibilant: buses /sɪz / or /sɛz /, bridges ...

Therefore, it will be pronounced as a [z] when it is in plural form. Apples, zz, zz, apples. When the final sound of the noun in singular form is unvoiced, then the S will also be unvoiced, pronounced as an [s], ss. For example, the word 'ship'. P is an unvoiced consonant sound, therefore, ships, ss, ss, ss,...

So, If the sound before the final sound before the s is voiced, then the pronunciation of the plural is /z/ for example, words, deals, fans etc. If the pronunciation of the plural s is /s/ then the final sound before that s must be unvoiced. For example books, hats, myths etc

Pronunciation of plural 's' - One to One Oral English ...

Regular English plurals fall into three classes, depending upon the sound that ends the singular form: Where a singular noun ends in a sibilant sound— /s/, /z/, /ʃ/, /ʒ/, /tʃ/ or /dʒ/ —the plural is formed by adding /ɪz/ or /əz/ (in some transcription systems, this is abbreviated as /ɪz/).

Rule : Any time a word has a sound just before the plural “s” that has NO vibration in the vocal

In English, we mostly form the plural of a noun by adding ‘s’. In some cases we add ‘es’: 1 dog, 2 dogs 1 class, 2 classes At the end of a word, ‘s’ has two possible pronunciations: /s/...

Pronunciation of ‘s’ and ‘es’ plural endings - Speakspeak

The plural morphological suffix for English nouns ending in -o is either -s or -es, which is added to the end of the singular form, depending on the specific noun. If the singular form of the noun ends with an o preceded by another vowel or vowel sound, then the plural morphological suffix is -s.
